

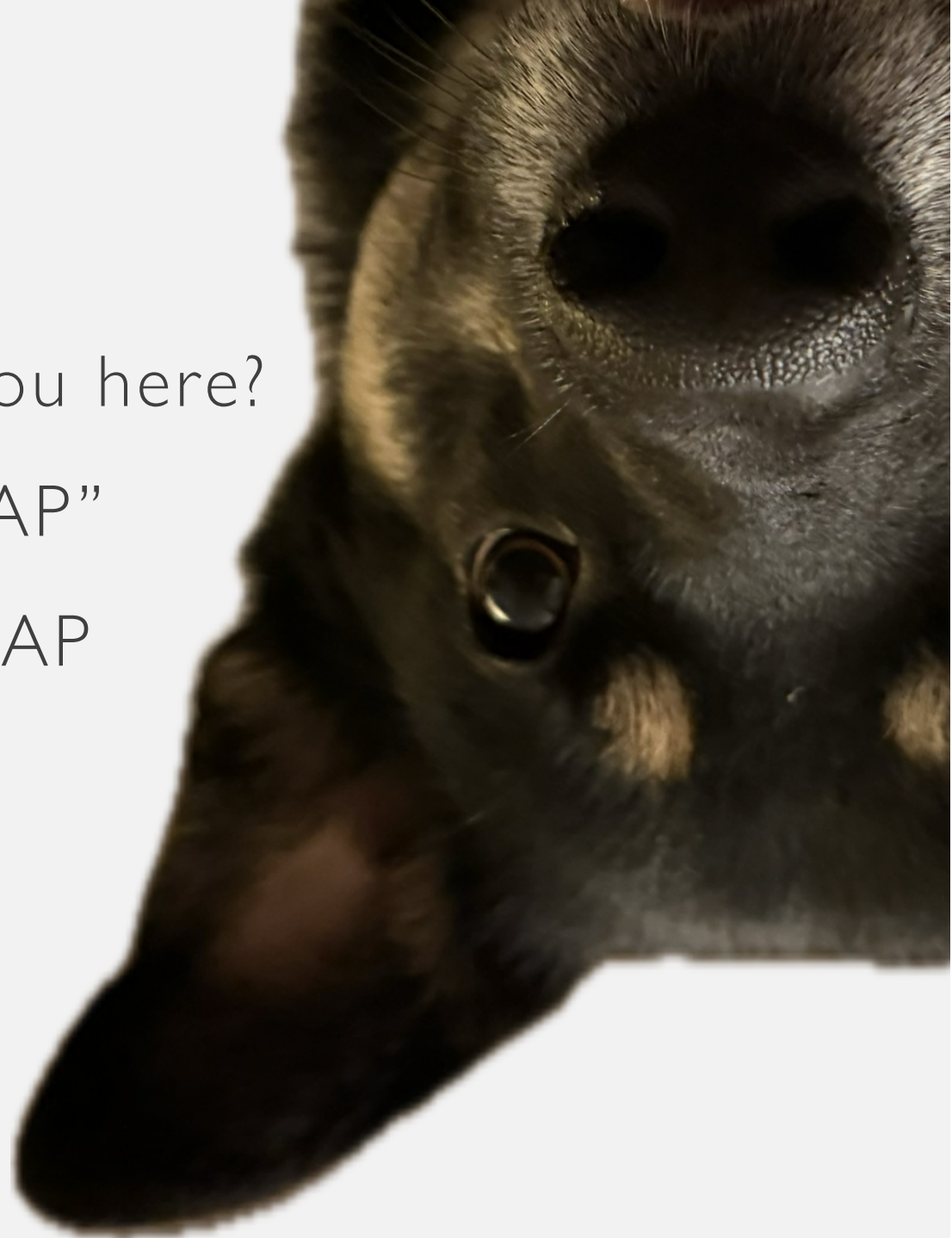

# What makes scholarship collaborative?

- Responsibility
- Not looking elsewhere for solutions, or expecting others to do the work (or make the change) for you
- What can *you* do for others (and for yourself)?
- Being with others can give us confidence (not accountability), support, trust, space to listen and be listened to, capacity to adapt and let go, and ... ?

feminisms

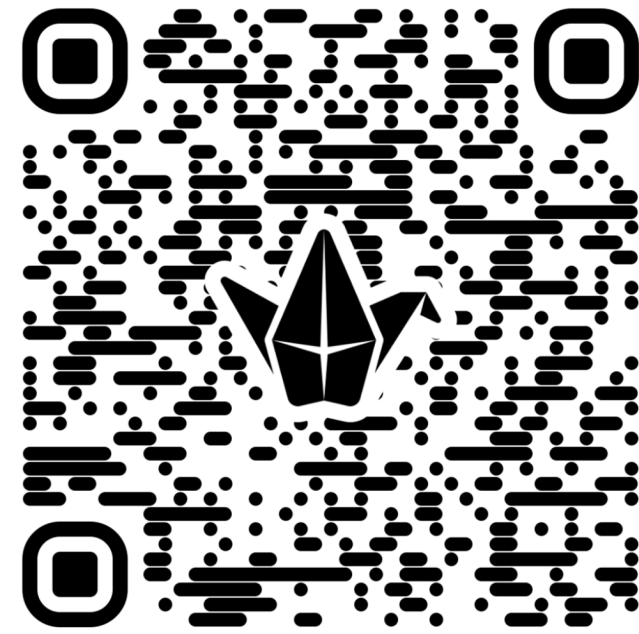




# Scholarship in EAP
