

## Facilitating class discussions online (advice and tips for discussions)

- Build community
- Set expectations
  - To what extent should they participate?
  - How many words?
- Teacher presence
  - When will you respond?
  - How often?
- Structured discussions
  - Framed around a reading/audio/video
  - Ask open ended questions
- Possibilities
  - Set the scene for a debate – divide the class into opposing sides
