## Research Funding Stream 2022

### Information Sheet and Call for Applications



BALEAP, The Global Forum for EAP Professionals, supports the development of those involved in learning, teaching, scholarship and research in English for Academic Purposes. In honour of this, we are seeking individual or group applications for our Research Funding Scheme, now in its 3rd year.

Building on previous successful funding initiatives which have seen a focus on specific themes, such as *Collaboration*, *Innovation*, and *Social Justice*, BALEAP have now decided to open up the fund to any research that will advance the field of EAP. Therefore, we seek proposals addressing research problems in areas including, but not limited to, EAP pedagogy, leadership and professional development.

### Aims

The funding initiative aims to encourage scholarship and practitioners' research in EAP. The scheme supports members who might otherwise find it difficult to engage in scholarship. As well as providing financial support, the scheme will include mentorship at various stages of the projects.

### Funding available

Applicants can apply for funding of **up to £5,000**, based on anticipated costs incurred. A finance guide has been attached to this email.

## Eligibility

Applications from individuals, single institutions, cross-institution and global collaborations are welcome. Individual applicants, and one member of collaborative applications, must be a BALEAP member\*.

\*Membership includes institutional, individual, concessional.

## Evaluation Criteria

The project proposals will be evaluated according to the following criteria by a panel selected across the BALEAP membership.

- Relevance to the field of EAP
- Quality of the proposal
- Impact, sustainability and transferability

The criteria has been attached to this email.

## Outputs

We encourage a range of potential outputs, appropriate to the scale of the project. Potential outputs might include (but are not limited to): a publication in an academic journal, an educational blog, a conference presentation, a set of pedagogical resources, multimodal posters/reports, video interview, infographics through the BALEAP website. Please note that participation in a BALEAP event (potentially online), or a short written or multimedia account for the website, is *required*. Initial output should be planned for Summer 2023 (bar formal academic publications).
